



Facilitated Enrollment for Child Health Plus, Family Health Plus and Medicaid

New York State's Health Insurance Programs for Children and Adults



What is Facilitated Enrollment?

Facilitated Enrollment is a program that helps New York State Residents apply for health insurance for themselves and their children. Enrollers, located at convenient community sites, will assist families complete the application, collect the needed documentation and submit the completed application to the appropriate agency. Eligibility is based on income guidelines determined by the New York State Department of Health.

Children under the age of 19 may be eligible for either:

Child Health Plus "A" (formerly children's Medicaid)
or Child Health Plus "B"

Adults between the ages of 19-64 may be eligible for either:

Medicaid
or Family Health Plus



What is Family Health Plus?

Family Health Plus is New York State's health insurance program for adults who do not have health insurance-either on their own or through their employer-but have incomes too high to qualify for Medicaid. Family Health Plus is available to single adults, couples without children, and parents with limited income, who live in New York State and are United States citizens or fall under one of many immigrant categories.

What is Child Health Plus "A"?

Child Health Plus A, formerly known as Medicaid is a free health insurance program for children under age 19 that offers complete coverage for all of their health care needs. Eligibility is based on income, family size and immigration status.

What is Child Health Plus "B"?

Child Health Plus B is a New York State insurance program for children under age 19 who are not eligible for Child Health Plus A and who have limited or no health insurance. Even if your income is fairly high, you may be eligible for Child Health Plus B. Depending on your income the coverage may be free or you may have a monthly contribution.



What Services will I receive with Family Health Plus, Child Health Plus or Medicaid?

Inpatient hospitalization, emergency care, out patient care, lab tests and x-rays, primary and preventive health care, vision, speech and hearing services, durable medical equipment, prescription drugs, dental care (Child Health Plus only), diabetic supplies, Mental health alcohol and substance abuse treatment (some limits apply), well child care, immunizations, physical exams, and more
